1. OCCI CHAIRPERSON'S NEW YEAR'S ADDRESS

OCCI Chairperson's New Year's Address: Leveraging Our Wealth of Strengths and Attractions to Make Osaka a Powerhouse of Economic Growth and a Popular Destination

In 2023, we were finally able to bid good riddance to the chaos of Covid. Since spring, we have seen a return to normal economic activity and a sharp recovery in demand driven by inbound tourism, and a vitality not seen since pre-pandemic days. Now, we face a pile of new mid-to-long-range challenges, including global instability, the need to boost innovation and bolster Japan's international competitiveness, climate change and ongoing efforts to usher in a circular economy, and securing the wellbeing of the nation and its people. This is a time of change and thus we must strive to shape the future through bold action, frank discussion, and the flexibility to adapt to changes and developments.

Meanwhile, the 2025 World Expo is set to attract participants from 160 countries and regions, as well as the United Nations, the European Union, ASEAN, the African Union Commission, and the International Red Cross. The expo's main theme is Designing Future Society for Our Lives, which is nothing less than the achievement of the UN's Sustainable Development Goals and the introduction of Industry 5.0 and Society 5.0.

The expo will be a golden opportunity for Osaka and the broader Kansai region to demonstrate its ability to overcome global divisions and work with other countries to address increasingly complex social challenges and help make the SDGs, Industry 5.0, and Society 5.0 reality. With just a year to go, we must overcome negativity being directed toward the expo and remind ourselves of the true significance of holding the World Expo here in Osaka and the Kansai region.

We at the OCCI are working hard to facilitate collaboration among industries and fields, and to build up local factory networks, not only to boost the momentum of Osaka's post-Covid, innovative economy, but also to make a difference toward solving the many challenges facing society.

For instance, we are promoting cross-industry tie-ups and facilitating demonstration testing in the life sciences and wellness space?one of our region's particular strengths?with a focus on themes such as medical-industrial collaboration, disaster medical care, people-friendly hospitals, and reducing the burden on doctors and other medical personnel.

Meanwhile, the Osaka Health Care Pavilion, the expo pavilion of Osaka City and Prefecture, will support innovation by local manufacturers through exhibitions featuring local SMEs. These will focus on themes such as sustainable fashion, combining local factories' strengths to address global challenges, and the "wellness office." In the run-up to the expo, the heart of the city is this being positioned as a forum for interaction and a testing ground for the future society, and to that end there are some major development projects underway, including the first and second phases of the Umekita area north of Osaka Station and the revamp of the Namba Station surrounds. At the same time, we must not neglect to burnish Osaka's tourist destinations, such as its many traditional shopping streets, cruises to Yumeshima, and the many, many festivals.

Moreover, are committed to helping revitalize the Greater Minami area, which extends from Osaka city's Minami neighborhood to Kansai International Airport and incorporates Osaka's southern districts, spreading the word about the many attractions, including its rich history, culture, and cuisine.

I am convinced that, as Japan has emerged from the chaos of the Covid era, now is time to unleash our wealth of strengths in the quest for new growth. One of our most important tasks is to support SMEs in Osaka and the Kansai region and help them build their businesses on sturdy bedrock. The OCCI and its five branches, the Osaka SME Revitalization Council, and the Osaka Business Ownership Succession Support Center make up a robust support regime, working alongside businesses to provide help for financing, mid-to-long-range planning, DX, IT, sales channel development, entry into new fields, overseas expansion, corporate revitalization, ownership succession, and more.

Looking to boost business with the ASEAN region?a global growth hub?have established the ASEAN-Japan Business Promotion Platform as a source of support for businesses in Osaka and throughout the ASEAN region to develop overseas sales channels and drive investment.



#### 2. GIF OSAKA 2023 UPDATES

GIF Osaka Meet-ups



Osaka, Hyogo, and Kyoto to exhibit in the Japan Tech booth, which we co-host within the startup-focused Eureka Park area of the 2024 Consumer Electronics Show (CES), the world's largest tradeshow, between January 9 and 12, 2024.

The Osaka-based exhibitors were:

Horiuchi Machinery (hydraulic cylinders that eliminate oil leaks and minimize electricity consumption)

Kaltec (innovative air purifiers that use photocatalysts)

Jikantechno (motor casings made from biomass carbons, resins, and magnetic

materials)

Cool Flash (medical devices to treat hot flashes).

This year's CES was a huge affair, with participants from more than 150 countries and regions worldwide attracting some 130,000 visitors, a much larger audience than last year. The Japan Tech booth was a popular stop for hungry businesses?and media, too. One repeat participant and OCCI member reported that visitor numbers were way up over last year, and that the event had been very fruitful, including offers of investment and numerous in-depth talks with major corporations which were likely to lead to new business.

While here, they visited Xport (pronounced "cross port"), the city center hub for open innovation operated by the OCCI and the Osaka Institute of Technology, as well as the currently-under-construction venue of the 2025 World Expo to be hosted here in Osaka.

Business Seminar as part of its greentech-focused initiatives under the ASEAN-Japan

### 6. 2024 NOTO PENINSULA EARTHQUAKE

We at the OCCI would like to express our condolences and sympathies to the victims of, and the many people still affected by, the earthquake that struck the Noto Peninsula in Ishikawa Prefecture on New Year's Day 2024. The quake, which measured a maximum of seven on the Japanese "shindo" scale of seismic intensity, has caused extensive damage.

An urgent survey of OCCI member companies, which focused mainly on those based in

Osaka, revealed that 30% of respondents have either been impacted by the earthquake or are

concerned about its future impact. Many expressed concern about the impact on supply

chains.

At a press conference on January 1, 2024, OCCI Chairperson Shingo Torii noted the close

personal and business ties between the Kansai region and the stricken areas. Where supply

chains have been disrupted, the OCCI would provide necessary support.

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres also spoke about the earthquake, saying he was

deeply saddened by the loss of life and damage. He offered his condolences to the families of

the victims and wished those who were injured a speedy recovery.

The Japanese Red Cross Society is currently setting up relief activities in the affected areas

and will work in cooperation with government agencies and other organizations to provide
